I. Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you;

before you came to birth I consecrated you. We do not belong to ourselves; we belong to

God. God alone has true authority over my life.

Karl Rahner:

God has loved him from eternity. He has borne him in his mind from everlasting to everlasting. There was never a moment, while God lived and thought and loved,

"Blessed are the merciful; they shall obtain mercy."



- 11. A person cannot forgive up to 490 times without gorgiveness becoming part of the habit structure of his being. Forgiveness is not an occasional act; it is a permanent attitude. Continuing posture and disposition in human relationships.
- III. Retaliation, revenge, memories of hurt are actions and thought patterns imbedded in our nature.
  - a. personal = how easily past hurts are resurrected in family life; how readily we remember!
  - b. judicial and legislative system demonstrate society's inability to structure rehabilitative forgiveness into the patterns of social life.
