SCRIPTURE TEXT: I TIMOTHY 6: 6-11; 17-19

Brothers and sisters: Little Children Love to Pretend.
They play games and dress up like grown-ups and other imaginary and heroic creatures. Games are good for Children, because they are larger than real life, like everything is large to a child. Games give children something to shoot for, something to aim at, to grow up to. In a game of pretend, the little heroes and heroines try out their scarey feelings and adventurous urges and explore their more dangerous aggressions on a safe stage. Playtime is not forever--dinner time always interrupts and suddenly it is time for pajamas and bed.

GAMES. SAINT PAUL TELLS US THAT WE MUST LEAVE THEM ASIDE, AND GROW UP SOMETIME: "WHEN I WAS A CHILD, I USED TO TALK LIKE A CHILD, THINK LIKE A CHILD, REASON LIKE A CHILD. I know a young woman named Ginny, a senior in high school--talented, caring, concerned about others --looking eagerly to her future. Her uncle, a priest friend of mine, asked her recently what she wanted to do when she graduated from college later on. "I don't know," she said, "but I would like to help other people." "Why not be a teacher?" he suggested. "Oh no!" she quickly replied, "teachers don't make enough money."

Another aquaintance of mine, with a master's degree in special education for teaching deaf children, works in a large state institute for the deaf in a midwestern state. His starting salary was under 12,000 dolllars a year-less than he would make as a trainee to be a manager in a McDonalds or a Burger King or other fast food restaurant. Starting out Ph.D's in psychology, working as school counsellors make far less than auto mechanics or plumbers. It is very difficult to find counsellors for alcoholic and drug treatment centers, dorm supervisors in facilities for troubled youths, teachers for the handicapped, social workers and administrators for services to any of the

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MARGINALIZED PEOPLE OF OUR SOCIETY. MOST OF THESE
JOBS PAY BARELY LIVING WAGES IF THAT.

No, Ginny--if you want to give your life to helping others, you better resign yourself to be not very well paid--if that is your criterion for success: how much money you are going to make. Here the judgement of Jesus is sad indeed: "you cannot serve God and Mammon." And the warning of Saint Paul to the youthful Timothy rings true: "Those who want to be rich are falling into temptation and a trap."

I DO NOT WANT TO SAY THAT WE DO NOT NEED PLUMBERS AND HIGH TECH INDUSTRIAL SCIENTISTS AND ENTREPRENEURS. OR THAT AN HONEST ASSISTANT MANAGER IN A WENDY'S OR McDonald'S IS NOT PERFORMING A USEFUL SERVICE. THERE IS NOTHING INTRINSICALLY EVIL ABOUT THE WORLD OF BUSINESS, COMMERCE AND FINANCE. THERE IS NOTHING WRONG, AND A GREAT DEAL RIGHT--IN THE GENIUS OF BUSINESS, PRODUCTIVITY, THE PROVIDING OF GOODS AND SERVICES, THE DEVELOPMENT OF INDUSTRIES AND MARKETS, THE PROVIDING OF JOBS AND LIVELIHOODS FOR PEOPLE EVERYWHERE. GOD GAVE US ALL THE GOOD THINGS OF THIS WORLD AND OUR TALENTS AND SKILLS TO BE CREATIVE AND TO PROVIDE FOR OUR NEEDS AND THE NEEDS OF ALL HIS CHILDREN. BUT THE PURSUIT OF PRIVATE GAIN AND THE ACCUMULATION OF UNNECESSARY POSSESSIONS ARE ILLUSIONS, DANGEROUS ILLUSIONS WHICH ROB HUMAN POTENTIAL AND EVENTUALLY DESTROY OUR SPIRIT AS THE CHILDREN, THE PEOPLE OF GOD.

You are our treasure--which money cannot buy, and no amount of money spent on you, no amount of money you can ever materialize yourself in the future--is worthy of you. You are purchased, St. Paul tells us, by the blood of Christ, at an inestimable cost. (cf. 1 Cor. 6:20). You are priceless, beyond all price. You cannot be bought and it is a sin to give yourself away for any earthly price. There is a dirty word for that: we call it "prostitution"-- to put a price on that which is priceless, beyond all cost.

WE CELEBRATE WITH YOUTODAY THIS HOLY SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: THE SACRAMENT CALLED GIFT. As THE SUCCESSOR OF THE APOSTLES, I WILL LAY MY HANDS UPON YOU AND SAY "RECEIVE THE GIFT OF THE SPIRIT!"--BECAUSE THAT IS WHO YOU ARE, OH GREAT GIFT OF GOD! YOU ARE "GIFT" BEYOND ALL PRICE, MOST DEAR, MOST PRECIOUS--WORTH FAR MORE THAN ALL THE TREASURES OF GOD'S GOOD WORLD!

You are worth more than all this: birds of the field, lilies on the hill. "Do not worry then about 'what shall we eat?' or 'what shall we drink?' or 'with what shall we clothe ourselves?' For all these things the pagans eagerly seek; for your heavenly father knows that you need all these things. But seek first his kingdom and justice—and all things necessary shall be given to you." [matt. 6: 31-33]—so Jesus Lovingly

TELLS YOU TODAY.

My young friends, dearest gifts of God's most precious Love: "All things belong to you, for you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God!" [1 Cor. 3: 22-23] These words of Saint Paul are so very true for you today.

MAY YOU LEARN THIS LESSON OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION TODAY. YOU ARE NO LONGER LITTLE CHILDREN OF GAMES AND PLAY-ACTING, "TOSSED HERE AND THEIR BY EVERY WIND OF FOOLISHNESS, EVERY WHIM OF DECEIT AND LIES, (CF. EPHESIANS 4:14), BUT YOU ARE CALLED TO GROW UP IN EVERY RESPECT TO THE VERY FULLNESS OF CHRIST HIMSELF, ADDING TO HIS VITALITY AND HIS STATURE, ALL THE GIFTS OF YOUR BEING WITH GOD SO ABUNDANTLY PROVIDES.

Your dignity and value in this world is beyond price: for you are joined to Christ, and with Him you proceed forth from God as lights for the world, gifts for the world's redemption, healing, upbuilding, reconciliation. CONFIRMATION HOMILY 1986-1987

I know a young woman named Ginny, a senior in high school-talented, caring, concerned about others--looking eagerly to her
future. Her uncle, a priest friend of mine, asked her recently
what she wanted to do when she graduated from college later on.
"I don't know," she said, "but I would like to help other people."
"Why not be a teacher?" he suggested. "Oh no!" she quickly
replied, "teachers don't make enough money. And, without money, I
can't buy all the things I want."

Things. Things can make us happy, but they can also make us slaves: the care of things and the worry about them, the desire for more of them -- all this can sap our mental energy and push God on the sidelines or our lives.

Saint Paul say, "If we have food and clothing, we have all we need." That's an exaggeration to make a point; but, beneath the exaggeration there is a lot of truth.

Consider the money and time we spend fixing our hair, dressing up in the most cool fashions, spending more than we ought on all the latest clothes, accessories for our tape-deck or whatever it is that our own special little kingdom in nevernever land. American teens spent \$45.7 BILLION DOLLARS in 1983.

Of that, teen age girls spent \$16 BILLION dollars on clothes alone. Perhaps, boys spent so much on things it could not be measured.

Everything in the world we grow up in tells us that if we buy things we will be happy. Television, movies, music videos--all



show beautiful people surrounded by beautiful things. Characters live in fantastic pads--furnished with wonderful things. They wear perfectly coordinated outfits and drive the fanciest and flashiest cars. On soap opera sets even the telephones match the clothing and decor. Everything is always new, Always the most expensive.

The best clothes, the best food, the best home, the best toys, the best schools, the best boyfriends and girlfriends, the best sex, the best drugs, the best booze, the best career and future, the best vacations and retirement, the best marriage in the best life in the best of all possible worlds. This is America for you: your birthright, your God-given right to work for, to live for, to fight for, to die for. Nothing else matters but that you get what is yours by right, what is coming to you.

A life spent accumulating material things, buying bigger and bigger, better and more, is a life wasted, a life spent on delusions and unrealistic and expanding expectations: clothes do NOT make the boy or girl and all this ownership things only betrays our dignity as human beings created in the image and likeness of God. We are more than what we eat or own. We are who we are in the sight of God, no more, no less.

The great sin of materialism and conspicuous consumption big words for having a lot of things - is surely that we deny to
others what they dearly need for their well-being and even their
existence, as we accumulate and consume for beyond our own needs.
We sin when our wants deprive others of their needs. But what is
really wasted is not simply scarce resources. Children in
Ethiopia, in Cambodia, in Central America, are not starving simply
and solely because teenagers in America buy too much lipstick, have



too many designer jeans, or VCR's, - the real waste is the throwing away of our talents and our gifts in the pursuit of junk.

Boys and girls, what Christ and Saint Paul say is so true:

"Where your treasure is, their also your heart shall be." "Tell
those who are rich not to rely on so uncertain a thing as wealth.

Let them trust in God..." [Lake 12.34] That which wins our heart
is that by which we are ruled, that which owns us, controls us,
even enslaves us. The person who buys beautiful things does not
own what she or he possesses—but is owned by what on possesses—
he or she is owned by that car, that stero, that too expensive
wardrobe for which a person pays and pays and pays—with the misuse
of one's own talents and resources.

We celebrate with you today this Holy Sacrament of

Confirmation: the Sacrament called GIFT. As the successor of the

Apostles, I will lay my hands upon you and say "Receive the GIFT of

the SPIRIT!" --because that is who you are, oh great GIFT OF GOD!

You are "gift" beyond all price, most dear, most precious--worth

Nothing you own

far more than all the treasures the world has to offer.

(AN EVER BE GENTEE

HAN Who you are.

You are worth more than all this: birds of the field, lilies on the hill. "Do not worry then about 'what shall we eat?' or 'what shall we drink?' or 'with what shall we clothe ourselves?' For all these things that pagans eagerly seek; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first His kingdom and justice—and all things necessary shall be given to you." [Matthew 6:31-33]—so Jesus tells us.

May you learn this lesson of the Sacrament of Confirmation today. God "confirms" the good gift that you are with the special



seal of His own Spirit, His very breath, His very kiss of life itself; you are born of the essence of God Himself, you proceed forth from His fondest and dearest thought, you pour forth from the heart of His own dearest thought, you pour forth from the heart of His own dearest heart-beat: oh blessed children of God!

Your dignity and value in this world is beyond price: for you are joined to Christ, and with Him you proceed forth from God as lights for the world, gifts for the world's redemption, healing, upbuilding, reconciliation. You come forth from God--and you are sent by God with a mission to the world.

Yes, my dearest friends, you are different: this day you achieve maturity in God's sight and in ours, for you know where you came from, and where you are going. Receive the gift of the Holy Spirit—the gift of God's love revealed in the preciousness of who you really are. Practice the TRUTH of who you really are in all that you strive for, in all that you do—and become for us all the fulfillment of our Heavenly Father's promise, to bring Christ again—ever young, ever alive, ever true—to our world!

May you find strength in this Sacrament of Confirmation and in the Holy Eucharist, which is our food for life's journey. May these Holy Sacraments help you work for and witness to a different kind of world, a world so beautifully described by the poet, Langston Hughes:

I DREAM A WORLD

by Langston Hughes

I dream a world where man

No other (man) will scorn

Where love will bless the earth



And peace its path adorn.

I dream a world where all
Will know sweet freedom's way,
Where greed no longer saps the soul
Nor avarice blights our day.

One cold wintry night a ragged man came to a little music shop in London, England. Under his arm he had an old violin. "I am starving," he said to the shopkeeper. "I was wondering if you could buy this old violin so that I can buy some food?"

The shopkeeper took the old violin out of its case to see whether it was even worth offering to his customers. He drew the bow across the strings and was amazed at the full rich sound. Somewhere AT THIS VERY HOUR SOMEONE YOUR VERY OWN AGE, SOMEONE JUST LIKE YOU WITH A MOM AND DAD, LITTLE BROTHER AND BIG SISTER, WITH JOBS AND GAMES AND HOMEWORK, FRIENDS TO PAL AROUND WITH, KIDS TO FIGHT AND ARGUE WITH, PARENTS TO GIVE HEADACHES TO, WITH ALL THE LITTLE STRUGGLES AND VICTORIES, THE GOOF UPS AND MISTAKES, THE CONFUSION THE JOY AND DELIGHT OF BEING YOUNG--ALTOGETHER JUST LIKE YOU--THERE IS A SPECIAL SOMEONE. JUST LIKE YOU FIGHTING ACNE AND PIMPLES, ARGUING AND FIGHTING AND TEASING, WORRYING ABOUT TESTS AND COLLEGE OR POPULARITY, TRYING OUT FOR THE TEAM, WORRYING ABOUT A GIRLFRIEND, TRYING TO KEEP OUT OF TROUBLE--SOMEWHERE THERE IS A KID LIKE YOU WHO GOD WANTS TO BE A NUN, A RELIGIOUS BROTHER, A PRIEST, SOMEDAY A BISHOP OR POPE. YES, SOMEWHERE--SITTING OUT

THERE IS TOMORROWS CONSECRATED MAN OR WOMAN, CALLED BY GOD. SOMEWHERE THERE IS A SISTER AND A BROTHER IN A RELIGIOUS ORDER. YES--I AM LOOKING AT YOU-- AM I LOOKING AT A PRIEST OR DEACON OR BISHOP--LOOKING BACK AT ME THROUGH THIRTEEN YEAR OLD EYES?

You are the special gift of God, whatever God calls you to be. We who are older aske much astonished at this gift, because we saw you when you were very little, we held you in our hands--when you were so very small and all you were was a cry and a need for food and drink, clothes and shelter, and love. We took you home with us and did our best--making mistakes to be sure, because we are human and are weak and imperfect, not because we did not love you. Love you we did, and do and always will--for God has given you to us, that we might learn to love you as the has first loved us--and so you have been our precious school of God's own love.

BUT TODAY WE SEE THE FUTURE--WHAT YOU ARE ABOUT TO BE ON ACCOUNT OF THE GREAT GIFTS OF GOD THAT YOU HAVE AND THAT YOU ARE. "TO EACH PERSON THE MANIFEST-ATION OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IS GIVEN FOR THE COMMON GOOD!"

ST. Paul Tells us in our second reading (1 Cor 12:7)

--HE IS SPEAKING ABOUT YOU--WE SEE THAT TODAY.

YOU HAVE BEEN GIVEN A LOT, BROTHERS AND SISTERS--EVER SINCE YOU WERE BORN INTO THIS WORLD.

What other country or society has given more to its young people? Perhaps some of us have not dealt with you wisely. Some so-called gifts may have exploited your youth and vulnerability—and left you more confused than enlightened, more hurt than blessed. I can only apologize for my generation where we have been too self-indulgent and uncaring towards your generation. Where harm has been done you, I can only confess our common guilt and beg your forgiveness. The greatest tragedy would be if you return injury with bitterness and hardness of heart. I can only offer a hand of reconciliation and amends. Forgive us where we have hurt you.

BUT MUCH OF WHAT YOU HAVE RECEIVED FROM
THIS WORLD HAS BEEN GOOD--AND ALL THAT GOD HAS GIVEN
YOU COMES FROM HEARTS IN LOVE WITH YOU. WE GAVE YOU
THE BEST WE HAVE AND OUR HOPES AND DREAMS FOR YOU ARE
ONLY FOR THE BEST.

Much has been given you and the opportunities for your future are rich and lovely. But no more than is true for us all, of the older generation, is it true for you as well: no gift is given to enrich and inflate the one who receives it. Gifts are given to transform and change the one who receives—turning an empty and thirsty vessel into an overflowing fountain of mercy!

Speaking of the gift of the Holy Spirit, Jesus cried out:

IF ANYONE THIRSTS, LET HIM COME TO ME;

LET HIM DRINK WHO BELIEVES IN ME. SCRIPTURE

HAS IT: "FROM WITHIN HIM RIVERS OF LIVING

Reflections on the McGrath Confirmation Homily for Vocations Bob Kloos August $12\,$

First off, I don't like the use of canned thoughts. I presume each of the bishops will personalize and adapt extensively. I will comment on the copy, the thoughts presented on vocations, and add some personal recommendations.

The First Corinthians reading is excellent. It should be utilized more in the homily. I believe it should be stressed that each of the gifts, while unique and wonderful, are given for the purpose of the Church, and only have validity when used for the whole body. A brief discussion of "the common good" would be helpful. Even in a secular sense, if we lose a concern for the welfare of all, we attack the very fiber of our being, the fabric of our nation. We cannot survive a wholesale drive for individualism. Too much of our present day media lifts that up as the ideal.

Paul lists the gifts of the Spirit, all of which are essential if we are to meet the challenge ahead of us. Perhaps the bishops could translate these gifts into more familiar language: wisdom of discourse/tell it like it is; knowledge/know what you are doing; faith/trust; healing/make time for others; miraculous powers/talented; prophecy/say what needs to be said; discernment/sort things out; tongues/he can talk to anybody; interpretation/he listens well.

By now, each of the confirmandi should have some sense of his/her own gift. Perhaps it has been pointed out specifically by a parent or a teacher. Perhaps friends have constantly relied on you for just such a gift. Perhaps it is known to you and you wonder what is in store for you because of it. During the preparation for Confirmation, you have been challenged to find your place in a Church which appears very adult, demanding, narrow-minded, and impersonal. Here you sit, convinced of your own self-worth, certain of a number of your gifts, willing to offer what you can, yet wondering where your place is. You have a lot of company. Not only are the other young adults seated with you sharing your thoughts, your parents and grandparents are searching for a place in the Chruch. It seems we are all always working for a clearer understanding of our relationship with each other. According to I Cor 12, the Spirit has provided for the Body--it is up to us to sort out how. You are here today to mark the time in your lives when you join the search in earnest.

It would be good if the bishop could be prepared to demonstrate how some of the activities the confirmandi have performed in the preparation program have been demonstrations of the gifts. No matter how small the effort, the human investment, the time set aside, the apparent effectiveness, the gift offered by the young adult must be affirmed. "No big thing!" was a statement I heard a lot when I was growing up. I still hear it today. This world revolves around "no big things," especially if they are offered in love, no strings attached. The young people know how much they appreciate those moments directed toward them. They have to be reminded how important they are when directed toward others. That's life. That's the Spirit.

In terms of vocations, I don't think you can talk theoretically. Point to people who have affected your life, vocation, life-style, interests. Point out folks who have caused you to change course in midstream. do you listen to. It is important that young people see that adults have modeled (and still model) their lives after those who have inspired (Inspired is a word that comes from the same root from which we derive "Spirit"--I think!) There are some well known folks--Mother Theresa, Jean Vanier, and others who are worthy examples, but it would be important for the bishops to single out (not necessarily by name) those who have helped them identify gifts and do their jobs. It would be especially interesting if the bishops are moved by people younger than themselves. By doing this, they show that their job is "inspired" and one of service for the whole body. They feel "called" or compelled to do what they do because of the needs of the whole body. And while everyone may not be called to be a religious or priest, each of us is called to listen, to pay attention to those who inspire us, and to be open to doing what it seems others are calling us to.

I would like to see "Vocation" spoken of in terms of a call <u>from</u> and <u>for</u> community, family, school, church, world. I would like to see it as a call often articulated by real people. I would like to see it as a legitimate claim on our time and attention so that we don't overlook what might be for us a lifetime of happiness, a continual calling to be just what others need us for.

The Draft:

Page one--

Opening comments: "Are you as eager as you look to take on the challenge the Church offers?"

Instead of "little boy", focus on support from family, presence of family. Page two--

friends, teachers, builders, keep the list going!

Today, in this holy sacrament, you and I. . .build the $\underline{\text{world}}$ of tomorrow . . not just the Church!

Before you tell them they will be the consecrated religious of tomorrow, remind them they are consecrated by their baptism to bring Good News to a world. That will happen in many ways. One way is through a religious vocation.

I do not care for the approach of the bottom paragraph. "Yes somewhere. . . " sounds a little far-fetched.

Page three--

"We who are older. . . we sat where you sit!

Page four--

Apology should include the admission that it is adults who make the porn movies, import the drugs and make the distrubution of them possible. We have good reason to seek the pardon of the youth. We have also failed to challenge them with many of the responsibilities that were ours, character-building experiences that help us still today.

Page five--

The imagery on the Spirit seems too disconnected. Focus instead on the opportunity they have to be living water, and Exodus for their friends. There is much slavery today and they and their friends are victims. They know how free they want to be; they also know how much they have compromised in the past. If they truly allow themselves to be motivated by the Spirit, they will reach out to their friends and move them to safety, a promised Land.

Page six--

Before we can expect them to speak in response to God's call, they must first be more comfortable with dialogue within the Church. If it is the Church that often articulates the call to religious life, let the young people speak to and with the Church. Tell them to settle for no less than their fair share of time and representation in the local Church. The Church needs to hear from them.

Rather than focus on what is left behind when you enter religious life, realistically point out that anyone who makes a choice leaves alternatives behind. And when your choice is in favor of the needs of others, then often your own comfort is put second. But there is the satisfaction that at least in some areas of the Body, there is an awareness and a sensitivity to the whole. We are a "waking church" and we need the members to stir!

Page seven--

To serve Christ is not an easy life! It is a full one.

Possible one-liners:

"Take yourselves seriously. I do. I take you very seriously."

"Search for your gift. Your gifts. Take a good look at them. Thank God for them."

"Whom do you trust?"

"Who inspires you?"

"Who is/are your hero(es)?"

"When was the last time you, in the privacy of your own heart, knew what you wanted to do with your life?"

"With whom could you share that dream?"

"If you could ask one thing of the Church, what would that be?"

"If you could ask onething of yourself, what would that be?"

"Are you sure of God's love for you?"

"Could you give a year of service for the Church?"

"If you liked it, could you give one more?"

"Could you give a year of your life to a marriage, to someone you loved?"

"If you liked it, could you give one more?"

"When was the last time you sensed the unmistakable presence of the Spirit in your life?"

In his book THE POWER WITNIN YOU, Pat Williams of the Philadelphia 76ers tells a remarkable story.

It was a hot Sunday afternoon in 1980. A young cerebral palsy victim named Cordell Brown was walking through the clubhouse of the World Champion Philadelphia Phillies.

Cordell walks with great difficulty. He talks with great difficulty. Feeding himself is a very difficult task.

When people see Cordell coming, they usually turn the other way or pretend not to see him.
That's what some of the Phillies were doing as Cordell made his way through the clubhouse.

What was Cordell doing in the Phil's clubhouse? He had been invited there to speak to the players in a pregame chapel service.

What could Cordell possibly say to stars like Steve Carleton and Mike Schmit, who were far removed from his world of pain and deformity?

Some of the Phillies were asking the same thing when they sat down to listen to him.

Cordell began by putting the players at ease. He said, "I know I'm different." Then, quoting I Corinthians 15:10, he added, "But, by God's grace, I am what I am."

For the next 20 minutes
Cordell Brown talked about the goodness of God
in his life.
He concluded by answering the question,
What could he say to famous superstars
like Steve Carleton and Mike Schmit,
who were so far removed
from his world of pain and deformity?

"I send my messenger before you to prepare your way: a herald's voice in the desert, crying, 'Make ready the way of the Lord, clear him a straight path."

Cordell said in a loving way:
You may hit three-fifty for a lifetime
and be paind a million dollars a year,
but when the day comes
that they close the lid on that box,
you won't be any different than I am.
That's one time when we'll be the same.

"I don't need what you have in life, but one thing's for sure: You need what I have, and that's Jesus Christ."
