Brian and Patricia, no one can neasure the affection and joy that rests within your hearts today. And we, your family and friends, caught up in the magnificence of this moment, can only proclaim with the psalmist, "Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating this festive day" of your marriage.

Significantly, you exchange your vows on the Feast of Saint Thomas More, the Patron of this Church. Saint Thomas More, history tells us, gave up prestige and power, honor and heraldry, reputation and renown, and even wife, family and friends -- because, as he stood before God, in the depth of his conscience, he chose to follow God's law rather than the dictates of King Henry the VIII. For this, for following his conscience, Thomas More was condemned to death.

Patricia and Brian, there is a connection between this 16th century Saint and what you are about to do today. Marriage is pre-emiently a matter of your convictions about married love, in the context of a world in which conscience is relegated to material success, upward mubility, technological progress, and political expediency.

When you pledge yourselves to each other in marriage today you shall commit yourselves to each other for life - in sickness and in health, in good times and in bad, until death. Like Saint Thomas More

let no person or no earthly goal ever stand between you. Your vows are decisions of conscience.

yes, Patricia and Brian, decisions of conscience. Thus, to be true to the solemn and irreversible promises you make today, you must decide now that you will model your love for each other on the love God commanded that you have for Him: you are to love each other "with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind"; and, you will love each other as you love yourselves. In this way, you shall be "two-in-one flesh." It is a matter of conscience.

I repeat, it is a decision of conscience. Jesus tells us, "Love one another as I have loved you." There is no limit, Brian and Patricia, to God's love for you and for us. God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son for our salvation. What a challenge you give each other and what a sign you give to the world: to lay down your lives for each other, as Christ did for you, day in and day out, year by year, until the Lord calls you to eternity. It is a resolution of conscience.

I say it again - a decision of conscience, coming from the inner most recesses of your hearts. It is in the context of God's extravagant love for you and in the context of Jesus' unconditional self-giving, that you make Saint Paul's Hymn of Charity your personal and finest love song and the energy of your inerascible mutuality:

Here, Brian and Patricia, let me offer you a practical suggestion. Each year as you remember the Anniversary of your Wedding, open your Bible to this Pauline Hymn of Cove. Read it to each other, pray over it, assess your relationship in light of it, discern how you can deepen your love and, above all, act on it! Remember, a life lived in Christ is not only a blessing for you, but also for the whole society. It is a determination of conscience.

I reiterate - this marriage of yours is a decision of conscience. It is a clear choice, an irrevocable commitment, an unrepeatable reality, a unique calling, an unfathomable design, a radiant vision, a strong bond of unity, a truly divine vocation -- this, your solemn declaration of mutual and lasting fidelity. There is nothing else like this Sacrament of Marriage - except the love that God has for you. So, in the words of Tobit, let your prayer be, "Lord, be kind enough to have pity on her and on me, and bring us to an old age together."

Our prayer for you, Brian and Patricia, is simply this:
"May Christ find a dwelling place, secure in your hearts. May your lives
be rooted in love, rooted in love."

These secrets of God overflow in the Joy of your life, in your unselfish service to the whole Christian community, in your passionate defence of the unborn, your constant and anguished concern for the helpless, the uninstructed, the sick and the poor, in your hunger and thirst for justice. Only those who have risked all and given all can know the meaning of sacrifice. Only those who have offered their own sacrifice can find the quiet wisdom of suffering. Only those who suffer with Christ can know the power of His resurrected Spirit.

IT IS COMPELLED BY THIS HOLY SPIRIT THAT

My dear brothers and sisters,

It is a special joy for me to be with you in spirit today as you set out to experience the happiness and responsibilities of natural family planning.

You share in the creative power of God. As loving couples, you have so much to give. God has created you, not only men and women, but now in this wonderful sacrament of your mutual vows and consecrated life, you are reborn, made anew as one flesh, signifying and actualizing the union of God and man. In other words, you are as one, a true incarnation. In you, as you live your lives together, bringing forth children generously, sacrificing for one another and for your sons and daughters, instructing by word and example in the living testimony of our Faith--you incarnate the mystery of the Church itself. Here, in your homes as well as in your hearts, "God and man at table are sat down".

If we speak of love, we must look to you to show us. If we want an example of compassion, we look for a mother and father to explain it to us. If we hunger for peace and justice, where else in the world can we find it, if not at your table, where you gather your own about you?

The prophets themselves found no other way to speak of God than by the example you show in your lives. "Can a mother forget her child?" Isaiah asks. (Is. 49:15) Like a father, Hosea tells us, God teaches his own, leading them gently by the hand. (Hos. 11) Even Christ himself gladly submitted himself to a father and a mother: "And He went down with them, and came to Nazareth, and He continued in subjection to them". (Luke 2:51)

The sacredness of the bond of matrimony that you have contracted and continue to live by through God's grace, cannot be overestimated or exaggerated. We in the Church who are unmarried stand in awe of God's mystery in your lives as you witness to us the magnificence of His enduring love. TILL DEATH DO US PART--you bravely proclaim in a world fearful of commitments. FOR BETTER OR FOR WORSE, IN SICKNESS AND IN HEALTH--you witness to those of us who are afraid of the future, weak in our Faith, wavering in hope and in trust, lukewarm in love.

Your love knows no bounds--and like martyrs of old, you willingly pour out your lifeblood, the bloom of your youth, your energies, your dreams and passions. All that you have and are, FROM THIS DAY FORWARD UNTIL DEATH DO US PART.

No doubt there are wellsprings of God's hidden life deep within your matrimonial embraces, in the intimacy that grows within your committed and shared and bonded life. These secrets of God overflow in the joy of your life. Only those who have risked all and given all can know the meaning of sacrifice. Only those who have offered their own sacrifice can find the quiet wisdom of suffering. Only those who suffer with Christ can know the power of His resurrected spirit.

As you grow in love of Christ through each other, you must share this love. You know the Lord you introduce to others, for you meet Him daily in your most intimate encounters. You are secret to all of His ways.

You can answer with Peter the question of the Lord: "Who do you say that I am?"--for you know by your lives indeed--that the Son of Man had to suffer much. You know that no one can save his life unless he is willing to lose it for God, taking up the daily cross of life committed to Him and in the service of those He entrusts to our care.

With Isaiah's hero, you too "will not be put to shame" for like the Lord you follow, you will not expect always to be respected, listened to, or understood. You will speak truth in love, as He speaks in your heart, and you will live and love as He did, faithful until death. You will remember that the greatest teacher is not the one who is followed by the biggest mob, but the one who himself is the best disciple, the best follower, the best listener and learner of all. "The Son can do nothing," Jesus said, "unless he sees the Father doing it." (John 5:19)

So, learn of Natural Family Planning, learn from those who share this new knowledge with you, a vision of Christ. For others show us Christ, and in our walking with them, we find the wisdom that sets us free and afire with love.

As you go forth to commit yourselves ever more strongly to the sacramental bond of your married love, may you also renew your commitment to the One who sits daily at your table, so that your lives together may truly be blessed.

And, may you know the joys promised in the blessing you first heard at the end of your wedding Mass:

"God the eternal Father keep you in love with each other so that the peace of Christ may stay with you and be always in your home.

"May your children bless you, your friends console you and all men live at peace with you.

"May you always bear witness to the love of God in this world so that the afflicted and the needy will find in you generous friends, and welcome you into the joys of heaven."

Finally, let your love never be taken for granted, let it never be presumed. Let it be expressed each day in a thousand ways. Let it be the music that filters through the tense moments in the most difficult of days. Let it be the song you sing on the saddest of days. Let it be the rhythm of your dance and the vibration of your movements when you are together and when you are apart.

Diane and Richard, may your lives overflow into the lives of all your friends. May your
joy enrich the lives of all whom you will touch.
And may the Lord who now calls us to His Wedding
Feast in this Eucharist give you length of days
and the blessings of His Peace.
