- I. The real meaning of Christian play = a type of spiritual socialization.

 Competition, victory, the development of the human body, sticktuitiveness are all valid goals in any kind of athletics.
- II. Our youth learn loyalty, self-control, friendship, honor as necessary personal qualities for a cohesive team effort toward the goal of victory.
- III. But our youth must be taught to develop these transcendental impulses in the context of the Christian life:

self-control when tempted to sin;

friendship as regard for the dignity of every person regardless of race or ethnic origin, socio-economic class, or sex

honor as a certain deportment and pride as a member of the household of faith

loyalty to Christ and his Church and our teachings and values

- IV. Remember the context of our developing youth:
 - A. Their experience of adolescence:

new emotions
decisions about the kind of person they want to
be
their desire to explore deeper relationships
their psycho-sexual changes

- B. Their experiences of the world about them: collapse of common meaning: life is so much harder for them, so less clear
- V. Young people, too, desire to be saved. Like the jailer they are caught in a system of ocnformity to the false values of the world.

HOMILY: 31sr Sunday of the Year 4 November 1984 San Juan Bautista: Hispanic Youth

READINGS: MAL. 1: 14-2:2; I THESS. 2: 7-9,13; MT. 23: 1-12

My brothers and sisters! Whenever I see young people, I am grateful. You have so very much to offer: You are young, you have such life, such energy. Your songs, your dances, your gatherings wherever you are--all celebrate life. Nothing gets you down--at least, for long.

Oh, to be young! When I see how happy you are— I think, "Oh if I were young again...." When I see you laughing, fooling around, singing and dancing, I am like all other grown-ups: I envy you!

Oh, to be young! You have so much to teach my generation. Sometimes--yes--we grumble a little: you are too loud, too disorganized, you make too much a mess of things. You need to be a little more careful--sometimes. You act before you think--many times. You think, but do not consider all the consequences of your actions--often.

OH, BUT WHAT A GIFT YOU ARE, FOR ALL OF THAT. WE OLDER FOLK LOOK TO YOU WITH SUCH PRIDE AND ENVY, EVEN WHEN WE ARE FRUSTRATED WITH YOU. AND ALWAYS, WE LOOK TO YOU WITH LOVE.

Why do we take such joy in you? Because in you, young people, we are so rich in the promises of God! You teach us so much-and most of all-you teach us how rich are the treasures of God-beyond our imagining.

To be old--this is our wisdom: this is to know our limitations. Life itself seems to teach us a kind of humble wisdom this way. There is a kind of humility that comes when your hair falls out, or turns gray, or when your hips get wide and your shoulders sag and your face gets those funny lines in them. Then you don't walk so fast or get there as soon as you thought you could, or

MAYBE USED TO. AND MAYBE YOU DON'T EVER GET THERE WHERE YOU THOUGHT YOU SHOULD. THERE IS A KIND OF WISDOM THAT COMES FROM THIS--TO KNOW WE ARE MORTAL AND HAVE OUR LIMITS.

BUT YOUR WISDOM--LITTLE BROTHERS AND SISTERS--IS SOMETHING VERY DIFFERENT. YOUR WISDOM IS TO HAVE NO LIMITS AT ALL. "I HAVE MORE UNDERSTANDING THAN ALL MY ELDERS", THE YOUNG PSALMIST BRAGS, "BECAUSE I OBEY YOUR WORDS," [Ps. 119:100]. AND ST. JOHN IN HIS FIRST EPISTLE, PRAISES THE YOUNG, BECAUSE "YOU ARE STRONG AND THE WORD OF GOD ABIDES IN YOU, AND YOU HAVE OVERCOME THE EVIL ONE." [I JOHN 2: 14].

THERE IS A HOLY WISDOM TO SUCH BRASHNESS! TO BE YOUNG IS INDEED TO REJOICE IN THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD-BECAUSE GOD'S POWERFUL WORD HAS TO DO WITH BEGINNINGS--AND YOU ARE JUST BEGINNING: LIFE LIES BEFORE YOU WITH COUNTLESS POSSIBILITIES. REAL STRENGTH COMES FROM BELIEVING IN BEGINNINGS, NOT BEING AFRAID TO TRY, TO GET STARTED ON THE JOURNEY. EAGERLY YOU LOOK TO YOUR FUTURE: GRADUATION FROM SCHOOL, CHOOSING A PROFESSION, FINDING YOUR PLACE IN LIFE, MAKING A FAMILY OF YOUR OWN! YOU GROW AND CHANGE--AND BECOME EACH DAY EVER MORE BEAUTIFUL AND MATURE. Your EXUBERANCE AND YOUR SWIFT GROWTH THRILL US: THE WORD OF GOD, AND THE POWER OF HIS PROMISE TO BE WITH US ALWAYS GROWS EVER ALIVE IN YOU.

In the Church we need you so very badly. It is easy TO FALTER ON THE WAY, TO GROW WEARY AND LOSE HEART. IT IS EASY TO GET DISCOURAGED. WE NEED YOUR DREAMS AND YOUR HOPE. IT IS YOUR GIFT TO BE FULL OF HOPE: AND HOPE IS THIS: THE ASSURANCE OF VICTORY EVEN IN THE MIDST OF A LOT OF SUFFERING, A LOT OF DIFFICULTIES.

OUR READINGS ITHIS MORNING REMIND US THAT THE OLD ORDER OF THE WORLD OFTEN FAILS US. MALACHI CRITICIZES THE PRIESTLY LEADERS OF HIS DAY FOR MISUSING THEIR OFFICE FOR THEIR PERSONAL ADVANTAGE. JESUS IN THE GOSPEL TELLS US THAT TEACHERS AND FATHERS OFTEN DO NOT LIVE LIVES AGREEING WITH THE WORDS THAT THEY LAY ON THEIR STUDENTS AND CHILDREN. BUT ST. PAUL IN THE EPISTLE REMINDS US WHAT ALL THE READINGS IMPLY: GOD'S WORD IS TRULY ALIVE AND WELL IN OUR HEARTS AND IN ALL OUR AFFAIRS -- AND GOD'S WORD CANNOT FAIL TO ACCOMPLISH WHAT IT PROMISES--IF WE HEAR AND OBEY.

No one of my generation--certainly no black man--would ever dishonor you to tell you that growing up, and being young--is easy. I know it isn't. It's tough sometimes to be a kid. Everything changes so fast: you have to face a world that is often hostile and strange. You got to go into new schools that aren't too friendly. You got to try for jobs that you might not get. Sometimes people won't like you or hire you--because they don't like the way you look, or the accent of your speech. And in the midst of all this--you change too--and maybe you don't know the kind of person you are, or maybe your parents find it hard to know you or understand you. No, it's not easy to be a kid growing up.

BUT YOU MAKE IT. YOU LISTEN, YOU LEARN, YOU TAKE A LOT OF RISKS, YOU KEEP LAUGHING WHEN IT HURTS TOO MUCH TO CRY, AND YOU PICK YOURSELF UP AND GO AT IT AGAIN, WHEN YOU MAKE MISTAKES AND WHEN YOU FAIL EVEN WHEN YOU TRIED YOUR HARDEST. YOU NEVER GIVE UP--FOR LOVE NEVER FAILS. YOU TRY AGAIN AND AGAIN. AND YOU MAKE IT.

You make it, because you know who your real teacher is: it's Christ. He was a kid and grew up a kid "putting up with the cross and thinking nothing of the shame" as the scripture says [Heb. 12: 1]. You know who your true father is: Your God and Father who made you like you really are, who loves you the way you are, and who gives you every opportunity and provides for all your ways, who never will leave you however far you roam.

WE NEED YOU BECAUSE OF THIS PROMISE THAT YOUR VERY PRESENCE MAKES TO US: YOU ARE GOING TO MAKE IT. Your Love, your Joy and hope--it tells us that better THAN ANY WORDS. YOU WARM OUR HEARTS MORE THAN ANY FIRE. We ween you AT priests, BROTCENS, SISTEN, DEALOWS, 1.

WHEN PHILIP AND ANDREW WERE BRINGING SOME GREEKS TO MEET JESUS ONE DAY [JOHN 12: 20ff.] -- HE TOLD THEM TO LOOK FOR HIM IN THE SEEDS OF WHEAT. I THINK THAT HE WAS TALKING ABOUT YOUNG PEOPLE. ABOUT YOU.

LOOK TO THE SEEDS OF WHEAT. LOOK TO THE LITTLE GRAINS WHICH FALL TO THE GROUND AND DIE--TO BECOME A MIGHTY HARVEST OF THE FATHER'S LOVE. LOOK TO THE SEEDS.

LOOK TO THE NEW BEGINNINGS. LOOK TO THE YOUNG. LOOK TO THE THINGS THAT ARE YET TO BE BORN, YET TO BECOME. WHEN WE LOOK FOR JESUS WE HAVE TO LOOK TO THE SEEDS.

So WE LOOK TO YOU: WE WATCH YOU DYING TO CHILDHOOD AND RISING ADULT. WE LOOK TO YOU GROWING UP, MAKING MISTAKES AND LEARNING. WE LOOK TO YOU, MAKING IT, ALL THE WAY. YOU TEACH US HOW TO LEARN, LEAD US HOW TO FOLLOW, PLAY US HOW TO DANCE AND SING. WE NEED YOU ALL THE WAY.

Finally, - and I say this not as an afterthought, but save something important for the last - prize your hispanic gifts. To be young, gifted, and hispanic -- that where it's at!!

Be strong in your hispanic identity, and proud of it - so strong and proud that you not only affirm yourselves but also the identity and giftedness of others. God speaks comes to you my friends in the beauty of your culture and through your hispanic gifts he touches all people with the light of His truth. If you follow this path, I assure you - "whoever humbles himself shall be exalted."

Now let us come to the Table of the Lord with "God's tidings and all our efforts and toil" (Thessalonians). The Lord invites you as a special guest to his table, to streathen his communion with you and to comfort you in your sturggles and to confirm you in hope.

YOU MEN AND WOMEN OF THE URBAN REGION CATHOLIC
YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD--YOU STAND FOR THE YOUNG WHOM YOU
ADVOCATE, AND YOU ADVOCATE THE CHRISTIAN HOPE THAT THEIR
YOUNG GROWING LIVES STAND FOR. WE WELCOME YOU TODAY.

TODAY'S LITURGY SPEAKS A WORD OF WELCOME. TO HIS OBVIOUS DISCOMFORT, THE PROPHET JEREMIAH HEARS A WORD NOT ONLY WELCOMING HIM, BUT URGING HIM TO THE DANGEROUS WORK OF GOD THAT WOULD COST HIM HIS FREEDOM AND HIS VERY LIFE: "YOU SHALL ROOT UP AND TEAR DOWN, DESTROY AND DEMOLISH, BUILD AND PLANT." NO WONDER THE PROPHET DISCLAIMS: "AH, LORD GOD! I KNOW NOT HOW TO SPEAK! I AM TOO YOUNG!"

JEREMIAH RECEIVES THE WORD OF GOD INTO HIS MOUTH, AND IS STRENGTHENED BY THE POWERFUL PRESENCE OF THE LORD WHOM HE WELCOMES. JESUS ON THE ROAD RECEIVES THOSE SENT TO HIM BY HIS HEAVENLY FATHER BY THE INVITATION OF JOHN: "MASTER, WHERE DO YOU LIVE?" "COME AND SEE!"

THE WORD OF GOD WELCOMES AND THE WELCOMING WORD RECEIVES THE LIVING PRESENCE OF THE LORD OF HOPE IN THE CHILDREN OF THE KINGDOM, THE LITTLE ONES, THE YOUNG, THE GROWING UP, OUR FUTURE, OUR YOUTH.

JEREMIAH IS SENT TO WITNESS TO THE FUTURE, TO GIVE
A WORD REJECTED IN HIS OWN DAY IN THE SPILLING OF HIS

BLOOD, TO A GENERATION YET TO BE BORN: "HAVE NO FEAR...BECAUSE I AM WITH YOU TO DELIVER YOU, SAYS THE LORD." JESUS IS SENT TO EMBRACE THOSE WHO ARE DRAWN TO HIM: "THE ONE WHO COMES TO ME I WILL CERTAINLY NOT CAST OUT. FOR I HAVE COME DOWN FROM HEAVEN NOT TO DO MY OWN WILL, BUT THE WILL OF HIM WHO SENT ME.

AND THIS IS THE WILL OF HIM WHO SENT ME, THAT OF ALL THAT HE HAS GIVEN ME I LOSE NOTHING BUT RAISE IT UP ON THE LAST DAY." [JOHN 6: 38-39]

JESUS' CONCERN FOR THE LITTLE ONE, THE LEAST, THE LOST, HAS A CERTAIN SPECIAL RELEVANCE FOR THE YOUNG. It is an irony that our world which seems so to glorify YOUTH AND THE PASSIONS AND PURSUITS OF THE YOUNG AND IMMATURE, CAN BE AT THE SAME TIME STRANGELY INSENSITIVE AND UNCARING FOR THE YOUNG. THE MARKET PLACE EXPLOITS THE IMMATURE WITH SHALLOW PROMISES AND FALSE EXPECTATIONS. OUR CULTURE GLORIFIES STRENGTH AND PHYSICAL BEAUTY, PROMISES POWER AND POSSESSIONS TO THOSE WHO LEARN TO GRAB FIRST AND HOLD ON TO THE FASTEST. WE ARE TAUGHT TO IGNORE THE FUTURE FOR THE SAKE OF THE PRESENT, TO SACRIFICE THE VALUES OF EDUCATION AND ANYTHING THAT TAKES EFFORT, TO GLORIFY THE EFFORTLESS AND SELF-INDULGENT. SELF-DEVELOPMENT IS NOT A RESPONSIBILITY, BUT A EUPHEMISM FOR SELF-PREOCCUPATION. YOUTH IS NOT A CHALLENGE, BUT A MYTH TO BE EXPLOITED, PACKAGED AND SOLD TO THE GULLIBLE, AND TO THE YOUNG.

YES, WE SELL YOUTH TO THE YOUNG--A FALSE YOUTH,

AN ETERNAL YOUTH OF PLEASURES WITHOUT PAIN, POSSESSIONS
WITHOUT

WITHOUT STEWARDSHIP, RELATIONSHIPS WITHOUT EFFORT

OR MUTUALITY, POWER WITHOUT RESPONSIBILITY OR ACCOUNT
ABILITY. GRAB FOR ALL THE GUSTO YOU CAN GET. YOU ARE

ONLY YOUNG ONCE. ENJOY YOURSELVES--YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO

IT ALL--RIGHT NOW. THE WORLD IS YOURS.

Most lies are mostly true--the patently false is easily dismissed. But the lie that is mostly true seduces the mind so easily, and entraps the foolish heart. To this foolishness though, Jesus calmly asks: "What do you want?" "Master, where do you live?" "Come and see!"

JESUS CHALLENGES OUR ETERNAL QUEST FOR HAPPINESS, SO EASILY DELUDED BY THE HERE AND NOW, THE EASY ANSWER, THE QUICK BUCK, THE PAINLESS EFFORT, THE MORAL SHORT-CUT, THE HALF-TRUTHS AND THE PARTIAL COMMITMENTS: "WHAT DO YOU WANT? WHOM DO YOU SEEK? WHERE ARE YOU GOING?"

FOR YOUTH IS DESIRE AND LONGING; YOUTH IS A QUEST AND A QUESTION; YOUTH IS A SEARCH, AN ETERNAL SEARCH. INDEED, AS OUR HOLY FATHER POIGNANTLY SAYS, IN OUR YOUTH WE ARE ALL YOUNG AGAIN, ALWAYS YOUNG. "UNLESS YOU BECOME AS LITTLE CHILDREN," JESUS SAYS, "YOU SHALL NOT ENTER THE KINGDOM."

WE ARE BORN TO BEGIN, AND WE MUST ALWAYS BEGIN TO BE BORN, BE READY TO BEGIN AGAIN, A PILGRIM PEOPLE ON A JOURNEY HARDLY YET BEGUN. WE ONLY BECOME OLD IN

THOUGHT AND IN HEART, WHEN WE GROW CYNICAL AND DISILLUSIONED IN OUR DREAMS-ON ACCOUNT OF THE LIES WE BELIEVED. WE ARE OLD AND COLD OF HEART WHEN WE ARE DEFEATED AND DRAINED OF WILL AND ENERGY FROM HAVING TRIED ONCE TOO OFTEN-AND FAILED. WE STAY YOUNG WITH THE YOUNG WHEN OUR HEART-HOWEVER OLD IN YEARS-IS NOT MADE OLD BY ITS TEARS, EMBITTERED BY ITS LOSSES, EMPTIED IN ITS DEFEATS-BUT ENLIVENED, ALIVE IN ANY TRIAL, FILLED WITH NEW HOPES AND NEW DREAMS YET FOR THE JOURNEY JUST BEGUN. WE CANNOT BELIEVE IN THE YOUNG, AND OUR WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT WILL HAVE A HOLLOW SOUND, IF WE HAVE STOPPED BELIEVING IN OURSELVES AND IN THE JOY) SET BEFORE US, WHATEVER THE COST.

IF WE NO LONGER BELIEVE IN HUMAN POTENTIAL, OUR OWN POTENTIAL, TO GROW AND TO LEARN--HOW CAN WE INSPIRE A YOUNG PERSON TO STUDY? IF WE CANNOT HOPE ANYMORE OURSELVES, CAN WE ENGENDER HOPE IN ANOTHER? IF WE TRY TO LEAD ANOTHER ON A JOURNEY WE OURSELVES HAVE LONG ABANDONED, WILL WE NOT ALL STUMBLE AND FALL?

WE CANNOT TALK DOWN TO THE YOUNG--NOR CAN WE CREDIBLY WITNESS TO THAT WHICH WE HAVE NEVER SEEN NOR HEARD. WE CANNOT GIVE WHAT WE DO NOT HAVE. BUT IF WE ARE HONEST, HUMBLE AND TRUE--WE CAN GIVE WHAT WE HAVE NO MATTER HOW HUMBLE IT SEEMS: (***)** HOPE, OUR DREAMS HOWEVER TARNISHED, OUR HAND HOWEVER SOILED, OUR HEARTS HOWEVER HURT, OURSELVES--OUR IMPERFECT SELVES--GROWING SELVES, YOUNG SELVES, EVER YOUNG SELVES WITH CHRIST, WHO WITH US STRUGGLES STILL.

WE SHARE A COMMONG BREAD AND CUP TODAY, NOT OF A JOURNEY ENDED, BUT OF ONE JUST BEGUN, HOWEVER MANY OUR YEARS. "WE WOULD SEE JESUS," THE GREEKS TOLD PHILIP AND ANDREW, "THE GRAIN OF WHEAT MUST FALL INTO THE GROUND AND DIE," JESUS ANSWERED THEM, "SO THAT IT MIGHT BEAR MUCH FRUIT." [JOHN 12] SO WE TOO, WITH CHRIST, WITNESS TO ONE ANOTHER IN OUR LIVES. ALCOHOL, SEX, WHATEVER YOU FEEL LIKE. PEOPLE WILL

ADMIRE YOU AND RESPECT YOU ONLY IF YOU CAN BRAG THAT

YOU HAVE TRIED OUT EVERYTHING, THEREFORE YOU ARE

REALLY GROWN UP AND EXPERIENCED AND KNOW ALL THE ANSWERS.

How much do you really admire someone who shows off, who thinks he knows everything? Who never listens to anyone, or considers the opinions of others, but always does what he wants and has an answer to everything? That person has sold out--and really is pretty tired out and old and dead inside--because there are no more questions for him to be asked, no more that person durings to make, no more treasures to be found. He alled the person already has it all--and has nothing at all!

"The One who saves his life will lose it."

Jesus challenges his young friends in the gospel today

[Luke 9: 24]. Deny self--does not mean to put yourself

down--no indeed: it means-- don't sell yourself short!

A life of a lot of disease and early death, of poverty and injustice, where a few were rich and workmen could not even find jobs, nor bargain for just wages. Only a few went to school, then only the white and males. A life of racial injustice of the grossest sort, and all manner of discrimination against every minority: women, children, the poor. Today we are far from perfect, but the voices of freedom have rung accross our land.

Luther King once cried out-before you were born-and now you are Martin's dream-how proud he would be of you!

How proud he is of you! You will surely see that precious day of freedom and justice for all come true for all God's children. You will see an end to the arms race, an

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The gospel figure about putting new wine into old wine skins reminds me of the story about the town drunkard who ran out of wine. . . .

Well, I suppose we could say all of us are simply intoxicated with the idea of beginning a new school year, and that we cannot wait to imbibe the inebriating juices of academic pursuits, extracurricular activities, and, especially, spiritual formation.

Indeed, the scriptures of today's Liturgy lead us on a spiritual high, with basic thoughts and practical ideas as to how we might shape the Saint Ignatius High School into an authentic community of the disciples of Jesus Christ, missionaries unto ourselves so that we can be evangelizers for others and promoters of the kingdom of God, filled with the Jesuit charisms of reverent obedience to God, devout listeners to the Holy Spirit, and dedicated men of service - yielding to God's word so as to be free and available to minister to others. Yes, we are drunk with

pentecostal spirits and at the same time sobered unto reality by the Word just proclaimed to us.

To the ancient Corinthians Saint Paul affirmed, "To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. Students of Ignatius, these words are for you also. Each of you, without exception, bears the manifestation of the Holy Spirit. Each of you, without exception, is unique, special and irreplaceable because God created you that way. Take pride in the fact that you are marked with the image of God. Take pride in the fact that as person and student you are a singular bearer of insight into the mystery of an incomprehensible God.

Ignatians, when you "let go, and let God" work through you, wonderful things happen - "different gifts, different ministries, different works" - wonderful things happen. Wisdom dawns like a captivating sunrise; knowledge burst upon the earth like a stellar explosion. Faith enlightens a mind clouded with ambiguity; healing restores peace to an unreconciled world. Miraculous powers awaken the community in times of lethargy; prophecy compels the listener to be open to truth. The gift of tongues evokes the sounds of God, and interpreters of tongues bring fresh insight to human affairs. "But it is the one and same Spirit who produces all these gifts, distributing to each as he wills" - challenging you, daring

you, to be the best you are, the best you can become, and bring the best you can contribute. It is the one and same Spirit who forms you into the one Body of Christ, many and different though you may be.

Administration, faculty and staff, the Word of God beckons you to be collaborators in the mission of the Church as "servants of Christ" and "administrators of the mysteries of God." To do this conscientiously, you must not yield to the temptation of Saint Paul summons you to be compassionate and popularity. sensitive, but combine these with high ideals and strict regimen. Learn to accept the dislike of the students now, in the short term, so that you shall receive their love and praise later - when they are adults and are engaged in the building of the reign of God through work, the raising of a family as partners in marriage, or serving the Church as future Jesuits - or, better, as future Franciscans! In this way, difficult and tension-filled thought it may be, you will find yourselves, as Saint Paul says, trustworthy, with a peaceful conscience before God, and, indeed, "servants of Christ" and "administrators of the mysteries of God."

Dear Friends of Saint Ignatius, to his detractors Jesus asked, and answered, a gripping question: "Can you make guests of the groom fast while he is still with them?" Of course, not, Jesus responded. Fasting takes place when the groom is gone.

So, brothers and sisters, you and I must be inebriated with the idea of fasting. But, fasting refers not simply to moderation in food. Fasting in its comprehensive and radical sense means self-discipline in bringing the message of God into the affairs of people. Fasting means an ability to manage one's personal talent and resources for the common good. Fasting means a capacity to train one's mind and body to face the rigors of life. Fasting means a self-control to act on the basis of truth and not because "it feels good." Fasting means a power to confront the ugliness of the real world: racism, militarism, sexism, materialism, and forms of discrimination against the elderly, the disabled, the poor, and many others who do not look or think like us.

The temptation is to escape the realities of life and the demands of our culture - escape into drugs, sexual abuse, street gangs, cars, clothes, hair styles, ear rings, and money. But, the Gospel calls you to fasting, to discipline, to self-control - to be authentic men and Ignatians, fearlessly and confidently, in freedom and with availability for others. The Gospel calls you to make a change. As the song goes:

I'm gonna make a change for once in my life.

It's gonna feel real good, gonna make a difference. Gonna make it right.... I'm starting with the man in the mirror. I'm asking him to change his ways.
